

- heads toward the Leeward Islands -185 mph





HURRICANE MARIA 13th named- Category 5 - Monday September 18th, 2017

Impacted Dominica at approximately 9:35pm wind speeds of 155 mph. then impacted Antigua and Barbuda, Montserrat and St. Kitts and Nevis on September 19th, 2017, Virgin Islands September 19 – 20



The C& W Experience - IMPACT



2 Cat 5 Hurricanes in One Season

- Hurricane Irma strongest hurricane ever recorded in the Atlantic Ocean outside of the Gulf of Mexico and Caribbean Sea.
- Hurricane Maria first Category 5 hurricane to strike the island of Dominica on record.
- Hurricanes of such intensity occur once every three years in this region on average.
- Only in six seasons—1932, 1933, 1961, 2005, 2007, and 2017—has more than one Category 5 hurricane formed.
- Only in 2005 have more than two Category 5 hurricanes formed
- Only in 2007 and 2017 did more than one make landfall at Category 5 strength.

Bureaucratic red tape delayed restoration efforts...

 Required – Legislation/Agreement with Governments to enable quicker resolution times for importation of telecommunications equipment following a disaster.

The C&W Experience –Lessons Learnt



- 1. Humanitarian needs Priority
- 2. Secondary disasters to be considered with impact of major hurricane
- Flooding impact Dominica
- 3. Replacement costs for major infrastructure to be pre-determined
- replacement costs of existing infrastructure vs. replacement costs for improved infrastructure

4. Closer collaboration with interested parties/major customers

-be aware of their needs during a disaster : major customers were given shelter

5. More Satellite phones deployment to enable communication when major network down
