History of the CTU

- Established in 1989 CARICOM Heads of Government by treaty to be the inter-governmental telecommunications policy institution
- 2003: Defined a new strategic direction to address issues of information and communications technologies
- 2006: Established Connected Caribbean Initiative



- To foster connectivity between governments, organisations and people.

- To create an environment in partnership with members to optimize returns from ICT resources for the benefit of stakeholders
