


The region has seen phenomenal growth in mobile telephony with liberalization



### Progress Towards Development of Information Societies

- Countries in the region are at various stages of the development and implementation of national ICT plans & strategies
  - Trinidad and Tobago, first plan in 2003, with reviews in 2005, 2006 and 2008
  - Jamaica, first plan in 2000 with reviews in 2002/3 and 2006/7
  - Antigua & Barbuda, implementing Connect Antigua and Barbuda initiatives
  - Almost all regional governments have an official web presence
  - Based on the UN classification of government websites
     68% are at or above the enhanced classification

# Investment in ICT and Development Linkages

- Regional governments have bought into the notion that deployment and effective use of ICT can enhance opportunities for human and economic development
  - There are hundreds of ICT initiatives taking place across the region
    - Antigua & Barbuda Go Live with Island Wi-Fi (mobile computer and internet centers provide access to public school students)
    - Caribbean's Youth Poverty Alleviation through Tourism and Heritage project
    - Caribbean Regional Emergency Operations Centre Information
       Systems Project


### Connecting the Caribbean Areas of Focus

## Challenges on the Road to Caribbean Information Societies

- Infrastructure availability and affordability
- Capacity building not only basic ICT skills by high value skills in programming
  - •Institutional capacity building e.g. in project planning, implementation and monitoring
  - Innovation in financing for ICT projects difficult to secure financing for ventures considered risky
  - •Research and development opportunities e.g. no research networks in the Caribbean
  - Low levels of innovation incentives needed to encourage innovation
